

Parent Consultations and Annual School Reports.

This year we have altered our policies for reporting to parents. We will still be providing you with a written end of year school report, which is a legal requirement. This report will provide you with information about your child's end of year achievements and give next steps for the following year.

The report's will be sent home on the 1st of July. We have introduced a third Parent's Consultation for the Summer Term, which will give you an opportunity to discuss your child's school report and also give the teachers the opportunity to provide you with a summary of your child's school year. This is also an ideal time to discuss any concerns you many have about transition into a new year group.

We will still be offering you an opportunity to 'meet the teacher' at the end of our internal transfer days. 'Meet the Teacher' is likely to be held on 14th July between 3:45pm and 4:30pm.

National Curriculum Statutory Assessments for Year 1 and Year 2

Summer 2016 sees the introduction of new standardised assessment tests for Year 2 (These used to be called SATs tests)

Our children will be assessed in Reading, Mathematics and Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SPaG)

The tests will be completed during the weeks of 18th May and 23rd May. Our children are used to being assessed frequently using similar style of question so we are confident that they will be able to complete these in the same way they complete all other assessments that we do.

It is important for children to be in school in the weeks of 18th May and 23rd May. Illness is unavoidable, and should a child be ill on an assessment day, the teacher will simply complete the assessment on the child's return.

The information we get from completing these assessments will support the teachers when making their end of year judgements about a child's attainment and progress. The assessments are a snap shot of the child's progress and not as accurate as the judgement the teachers will make, based on standards achieved over a long period of time.

There is a very useful video on our school website (Information -> Assessment at UTS) which can give you more specific details should you require more.

In Year 1 our children are expected to complete the 'Year 1 Phonics Screening' this is a statutory assessment which all Year 1 children in the country complete. The information we collect through the screening, supports our teaching and learning and helps us determine 'next steps' for all our children.
