School Dinner Money Payment

This year there has been a lot of children requesting and receiving a school dinner without payment being sent into school. This has become a significant problem which we have had to cover out of our school budget. So far, we have covered £114.70 of debt!

We will never allow a child to go hungry, particularly as non-payment of dinner money is NOT the fault of the child. We ask that parents/carers take full responsibility for paying for meals IN ADVANCE. Money for lunches should be sent in before the meals are taken . We have a number of ways to do this:

Pay 1/2 termly

Pay weekly (On Monday for the week ahead)

Pay for Fridays (This is a popular option)

Pay on the day - if a one off meal, this MUST be paid before the meal is taken.

Caterlink, our Catering contractors have the policy of not providing meals for children who have not paid or who are in arrears. This is not something that we condone, however, in cases where arrears are not paid we will be advising parents to only provide a packed lunch until the arrears are cleared.

It is not fair on our limited school budget to cover lunches for parents who have chosen not to pay. Thank you to parents/carers who pay in advance.

NB - Children who received Universal Infant Free School Meals in Year 2 - please be reminded that the free meals are only available in Year 3 and 4 if you meet Free School Meals Criteria. If you do not, you will need to pay for school meals. (The costs are detailed above)

Ursula Taylor C of E Primary School - update

Great news! Our application to the Regional School's Commissioner, to seek permission to extend or age range from 4 -11years has been granted! This means we are able to really forge ahead with planning for September 2017 when we retain our current Year 3 children into Year 5.

We have finished our information booklet for parents, giving some detail about what Ursula Taylor will be like as a Primary School, which will be finding itself home to you over the next few days. It has also been uploaded to our school website (Minus the building design pages which we don't have in electronic format)

Our build is planned for beginning of Phase 1 of the Borough's Two Tier Project which means we will be beginning ground works and the site set up in early August.

We have spent a great deal of time looking at Logistics and the Safety of our children, parents and staff and ensuring the minimal disruption to our children during the build.

Our school website has also been revamped - with a new design which reflects the new 'look' of the school. We hope the new site will be easier to navigate and a little more user friendly.
