This is the sad part of headship that has to be done but is never enjoyable. I know this does not apply to the majority of parents although there are a small number of people consistently breaking our school policies. Ironically this is during our monthly value of 'Tolerance', although we are all learning that some things do not need to be tolerated! **Please** abide by the following...

Strictly NO Dogs on the school site. This is a source of great concern to some of our children. Our children come to school to feel safe and cared for, unfortunately this is not always possible when dogs have been brought on the premises. This includes not tying dogs up on the school gates.

Strictly NO smoking on the school site. This includes the grassy area by the bike sheds. Please do not bring lit cigarettes onto any part of the school site.

NO playing on the balcony areas before / after school. It has been reported that children are playing with the resources on the balcony whilst waiting for school to open in the morning. We do NOT have insurance to cover any injury to children before they are in the care of the staff. Please ensure your children stay on the playground until the doors are opened.



SCHOOL LUNCH ARREARS

It has been brought to my attention that there are considerable amounts of outstanding dinner monies owed to Caterlink. There will be reminders issued next week and I ask that these are paid promptly, especially as we are coming into the last part of the school year.

Caterlink ask for dinner money to be paid in advance or on the day the meal is for. They reserve the right to refuse a child a school meal if they receive no payment.

There is a very serious side to not paying for meals eaten. The money has to be paid to Caterlink. If parents do not pay for the meals taken then the school has to pay out of our budget. Our budget is extremely tight and cannot take the hit of paying for children's lunches. This money has to be paid out of the learning resources budget which directly impacts negatively upon your children's learning.

Badgers at UTS!

You may be aware that we have had terrible issues with our Badger Sett currently around by the Foundation Stage area. We have had holes in our field created by foraging Badgers, big holes in the Foundation garden and Mr Beacon nearly swallowed alive by a hole suddenly appearing. In order to keep our children safe and provide the educational experiences we have had in the past, we have had to take steps to move the Badgers.

Over half term an artificial Badger Sett is being created on another part of the school site, away from the problem areas. The Badgers will, in time be encouraged to move to the new sett through the use of peanuts and raisins! Once the Badgers have moved, the old sett will be closed down permanently. Unfortunately the Badger sett is so far reaching that the Mulberry Tree over which the Badgers live has become unstable and potentially very dangerous. In order to assure the safety of our children staff and parents, the Mulberry Tree will be removed. This has been a decision not taken lightly and over a period of many months of watching the problem become steadily worse.

Due to the protected status of badgers, we have had to follow a very strict procedure and abide by the laws of a badger licence. The process is one which is time consuming and expensive, I am pleased to say that this will not impact upon our general school budget as we have been able to secure funding directly from the DfE to cover something as unusual as this.

There will also be some positives to come out of this process:

- No more damage to our grounds!
- Foundation can enter their gardening competitions again
- A new 'values' tree can be planted in a more appropriate place
- The children can learn about badgers and ecology in depth during the process
- The BBC will be filming to make a programme about 'Britain beneath the Earth'! (Details to follow...)
- Year 2 and Foundation can claim their 'land' back
- Sports Day and future Summer Fairs can occur trouble free
