Spring Term 2016

Communication, Language & Literacy

Children will learn to:

- Use language to imagine and recreate roles and experiences
- Interact with others in a variety of context
- Use talk to organise, sequence and clarify thinking
- Talk and listen confidently and with control, consistently showing awareness of the listener
- Reading and spelling CVC words using a wider range of letters, short vowels, some consonant digraphs and double letters. Use phonic knowledge to read simple regular words
- PLEASE - NO TEACHING LETTERS NAMES**
- Attempt to read more complex words, using phonic knowledge
- Use knowledge of letters, sounds and words when reading and writing independently
- When writing use the cursive style to join our letters - PLEASE NO CAPITAL LETTERS**
- Retell narratives in the correct sequence
- Show an understanding of how information can be found
- Read books of own choice with some fluency and accuracy

Mathematical Development

Children will learn to:

- Recognise, count, order, write and use numbers up to 20 and above
- Use developing mathematical ideas and methods to solve practical problems
- Relate addition by combining two groups and subtraction to taking away
- In practical activities, use the vocabulary involved in adding and subtraction
- To develop the skill of explaining how they solved a problem
- Find one/two more or one/two less than a number from 1 to 9/10 to 20+
- Use a range of strategies for addition/subtraction, including some mental recall
- Use mathematical language to name and describe solid (3D) objects and flat (2D) shapes

LITERACY

- Tim Peak has inspired our topic on Space
- Poems on a Theme -Space
- Non Chronological report, list, labels and captions
- Instructions/Recipes - healthy space food
- Labelling rockets, information about rockets
- Writing lists, signs and posters
- Descriptive language - space poems
- Postcards from the Moon
- Letters and sounds Phase 2 & 3

Science

- To know that the push to make their rocket fly is a force.
- To recognise that when their rocket slows down and stops there is a cause.
- To identify different light sources, including the sun.
- To know that darkness is the absence of light
- The Planets - know simple facts about each planet
- Astronaut food - changes by removing and adding water
- Food groups - healthy eating

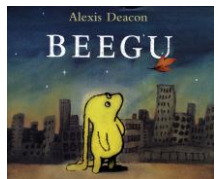
FOCUS FICTION TEXTS
