Attendance

Thank you to those parents who have informed us of any holiday absence planned. I appreciate you taking the time to let me know about absence, so I know why your child/ren might be out of school however, I am still unable to agree holiday requests unless there are exceptional circumstances. All request for holiday absence are responded to on an individual basis and in writing.

Please note: If a child is away from school and no reason is given, we are responsible for finding out where the child is and why they are not at school. This will involve a telephone call from either Miss Daley or myself. We have a responsibility for safeguarding and child protection for every child in our school and we are expected by the Educational Welfare Officers to follow up any absence to satisfy us that our your children are safe. This responsibility is something I very take very seriously. Please do not be offended if you receive a telephone call asking where your child is and why they are not at school, there have

been times when parents do not respect this responsibility and respond in a way which we find unacceptable. I ask that you always bear in mind that we are doing our very best to safeguard your children's well-being.

Also, I have been informed about some parents who are taking their children out of school and claiming that there have doctors appointments in far flung places. I would much rather parents were honest about their intentions and we are able to work together to ensure the highest attendance possible for your children. The higher the attendance, the more chance there is of a child achieving their best and excelling at school.

Thank you, once again, to those parents who respect the position I am in and those who are acting in an open and honest way regarding attendance / holiday absence.
