

Whole school attendance has recently been as high as 96.9% This is fantastic and we are very pleased that we have reached this figure. Our work now involves maintaining this figure and consistently achieving 97%.

On behalf of the Governing Body I would like to thank all of the pupils, parents and carers for the excellent news I have had from Mrs Morrall. Congratulations! Attendance has risen to almost 97% which is an excellent achievement: most importantly it makes such a difference to the children's experience of school and I understand that Ofsted would regard it as 'Outstanding'! Swimming

We are hoping to be able to start swimming in the week before the Half Term - w/b 19th May. This is heavily reliant on the weather. If we do manage to swim, it will only be for one session during this first week.

After half term (return to school on 2nd June) we hope to be starting our programme of children swimming 3 times weekly. Again this is weather dependent.

The children will need to have their swimming kits in school from the week of the 19th of May. Your child's kit **MUST** include:

- Swimming costume / trunks / shorts (shorts must not be overly large or baggy for safety)
- Towel
- Swimming hat (available from the school office for £1)

Children do not need to have Goggles or buoyancy aids of any kind. Floats and tummy bands are provided by school.

ALL ITEMS BROUGHT TO SCHOOL MUST BE CLEARLY NAMED PLEASE

If your child has any individual requirements relating to swimming please liaise directly with your class teacher.



PARENT SUPPORT FOR SWIMMING SESSIONS

We rely heavily on support from our parents in terms of financial support to contribute towards the upkeep of the swimming pool, and also as extra people to be present when the children swim. This year we have had to replace the boiler and also one of the filters, this is on top of the maintenance and the purchase of the cleaning materials and chemicals required. We are asking for parents for a contribution of £2 a week per child or a full term for £14 per child. This money is purely to support the school with covering the finances for the pool.

If you are available to help on swimming session days we would be very grateful. Each class teacher will let you know which days they will be swimming on and at what time. If you do sign up to help please make sure that you are able to commit to this, we had a some sessions last year that had to be cancelled due to inadequate staffing numbers. It is unfair to teachers in Year 1 who keep losing their Teaching Assistants at the last moment to cover a parent who has failed to turn up.
