In Year 3...


We have been very busy in Year 3 this term and the children have been working hard as always.



In Year 6, we have had a busy term despite not having SATS tests this year. We have been studying some Shape and Space topics in maths - including learning how to use a protractor correctly!



We have enjoyed the start of our House sports - cricket and rounders. Looking forward to Athletics next term.



Track and Trace over the Half Term Break

I (Mrs Morrall) am required to remain responsible for Track and Trace over some of the Half Term Break.

If your child is ill and demonstrates any symptoms of COVID, you must isolate and seek a PCR test. If you are unsure about what to do, contact NHS111 who will advise you.

If your child has symptoms over the weekend of 29th / 30th May you will need to let me know. (Through Class Dojo or by emailing: vmorrall@ursulataylor.bedssch.co.uk)

You will also need to ensure that you make contact with me to let me know the result of the test – negative or positive.

This is to ensure that if a positive test is returned, we can track back the contacts which your child may have had through the infectious period.

If we receive news of positive tests from staff or children, which lead to your child needing to isolate, you will be informed through Class Dojo. Please keep an eye on this in case this is needed. Any symptoms after Sunday 30th May, you must follow the NHS guidance re: testing and isolation. There is no need to inform us, until we return after the Half Term Break.







