#### School closure - Snow Day

We recently had to close for a day due to adverse weather conditions, which we appreciate is challenging for some families, especially those parents who work. We would like to outline our reasons for closure so all parents are aware of the decision making process and our Duty of Care regarding children, staff, parents and visitors.

We take closing the school very seriously and the decision is not made lightly. This is evident by the fact that you have to go back to February 2009 to find the last time the school closed for any reason, we even managed to stay open during a serious underground electrical fire which resulted in no electrics, no school kitchen for cooking 200+ school dinners, all whilst safeguarding all our children and staff and conducting an Ofsted inspection.

The decision to close last Monday was taken for a number of reasons. Whilst we appreciate that most children live in Clapham and could have walked, most staff do not and we would be failing to safeguard children with inadequate numbers of teachers to manage 350 children. Whilst many Teaching Assistants live in Clapham and would probably have made it into school, we cannot legally have Teaching Assistants in charge of groups of 30+ children without a teacher close by to support where necessary. It is also worth considering that a large number of Teaching Assistants who work in a 1:1 capacity and therefore are responsible for named SEN children and cannot lead a class or group.

Site Safety must be taken into consideration, both in terms of walking and also driving. As the snow fall was over the weekend, staff were not working or available to be clearing the school to a level which would have allowed safe usage. Even on Tuesday when we reopened, the grounds were very slippery, even with Mr Ruff's best efforts to clear and salt the paths and driveway.

When the decision was made to close, it followed consultation with the Senior Leadership Team, a large group of local Headteachers, consultation with the Borough Council and also all staff to see which teachers would be worst affected by the snow.

We hope this explanation makes our decision clear and even if you do not agree with closure that you can see that it was a necessary step to take to ensure the safety of all of our children, staff and parents.
